

THE SPRINGHOUSE NITTY-GRITTY

The cost of labour is set at \$49/hour

The cost per square foot does not include P&A (15%) and taxes (15%)

COST FOR THE ROUGH:

Includes: Foundation to roof, exterior siding, gyprock, plastering, electricity, plumbing and air exchanger installed.

Doesn't include: interior finish, paint, kitchen, bathroom fixtures, cupboards, light fixtures and interior doors, the garage, the veranda, architect's or engineer's plans, permits and certification, infrastructure costs (septic and well).

The costs are for labour and materials.

FINISH COSTS

Includes: Paint, moldings, floors, stairs, interior doors, interior and exterior light fixtures, cupboards and storage, kitchen, one full bathroom, one half bath & laundry room, exterior deck.

Doesn't include: Infrastructure costs and garage

COST OF GARAGE

Includes: Excavation, foundation, uninsulated walls, roof and basic finishing

Doesn't include: Electricity and plumbing

ENERGY PERFORMANCE

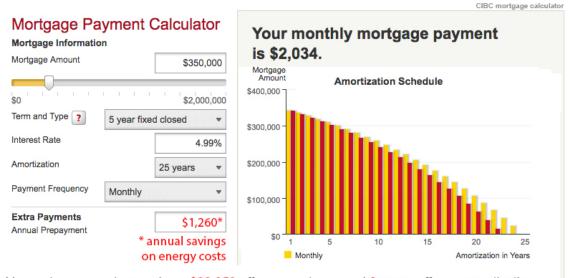
A blower door test creates a pressure differential of 50 Pascals between the outside and the inside of the house and then measures the flow of air required to equalize the pressure. Expressed as **Air Changes** per **Hour** at 50 Pascals.

THE FINANCIAL IMPACT

If one takes into account the cost of financing AND the energy costs of the house, over \$ 28,000 and two years of amortization are saved on a 25-year mortgage at today's rates.
